

Anderson Preparatory Academy Levels of Disciplinary Consequences and Supports

Level 1: Conference/Parent Contact

- School personnel and parent
- Conference with student

Level 2: Intervention Options

- Psycho-educational training: Student is provided materials/counseling intended to increase empathy, communication skills, social skills, and understand the impact of bullying.
- Referral: Administration, school counselor, or support staff.
- Time-out: The removal of a student from classes for one-half day or less.
- Detention: Detainment of a student for disciplinary reasons that takes place before, during or after school hours.
- School Behavior Agreement/Contract with student/parent: A written statement listing steps to be taken to improve behavior or attendance. The statement also describes the support to be provided by school staff and/or parent as well as the date when the contract will be reviewed.
- Restricted activity: The denial of participation in school activities/extracurricular activities.
- School/community service: Assignment of student to perform school/community service.
- Saturday school: Detention programs on Saturday with or without educational packet focusing on acceptable social skills
- A combination of any Level 2 option and Level 1 conference/parent contact.
- Other options as discussed among parent, teachers, and administrators.

Level 3: Out-of-School Suspension (1-5 days)

- Suspension with parent conference or the parent may attend school with the student for one school day.
- For each day of suspension, four hours of community service may be served.
- Suspension with parent conference and contractual agreement.
- May be in combination with Levels 1, 2, and 3 consequences.
- Other options as discussed among parent, teachers, and administrators.

Level 4: Alternative Consequences/Programs

- Modified schedule.
- Conditional school (able to attend school based upon set conditions).

Level 5: Expulsion Meeting/Expulsion

- Procedure with request for expulsion meeting.

In accordance with our student handbook, administration reserves the right to deem which level is appropriate for the bullying offense.
